Age period cohort (APC) analysis plays an important role in understanding time-varying elements in epidemiology. In particular, APC analysis discerns three types of time varying phenomena: Age effects, period effects and cohort effects.

Consistent age variations in a health outcome across time and place reflect the developmental nature of true age changes within individuals. On the other hand, period and cohort effects reflect the influences of social forces. Period variations often result from shifts in social, historical, and cultural environments.

The period function is set to zero for the reference date and the period effects are relative risks relative to that date. The cohort function has both the average and the slope set to zero and represents a residual relative risk relative to fitted values for age and period effects.

Age (years since birth), period (year), and cohort (year of birth) are exact linear functions of each other: Age = Period-Cohort (introduction of this issue; Winship and Harding, 2008). In order to estimate the relative contribution of age, period and cohort effects one must make one or more assumptions.
