Alligators and crocodiles look rather different up close: According to Owication, an adult crocodile can grow up to 19 feet in length, A crocodile looks almost tiny next to it, at just 14 feet in length. Beyond size, alligators tend to more of a dark gray than green, which helps it blend with its murky water surroundings.

There are three groups, or families, of crocodilians: the alligatoridae, consisting of alligators and caimans; the crocodylidae, consisting of the crocodiles; and the gavialidae, made up of only the gharial, a small fish-eating cousin of the larger, buffalo-munching crocs. Across these three families are 23 different species, that have existed for more than 240 million years - that makes them 65 million years older than the dinosaurs!
