Cognitive milestones represent important steps forward in a child's development. Throughout human history, babies were often thought of as simple, passive beings. Prior to the 20th-century, children were often seen simply as miniature versions of adults.

Cognitive Developmental Milestones

Types of cognitive growth through the years. A child in early adolescence: Uses more complex thinking focused on personal decision-making in school and at home. Begins to show use of formal logical operations in schoolwork. Begins to question authority and society's standards. Begins to form and speak his or her own thoughts and views on many topics.

7.7: Cognitive Development in Emerging and Early Adulthood According to Piaget's theory adolescents acquire formal operational thought. The hallmark of this type of thinking is the ability to think abstractly or to consider possibilities and ideas about circumstances never directly experienced.

At this stage, infants take in a great deal of information through their senses. Tactile and verbal stimulation and auditory and visual cues can have positive, long-range results.
