In linguistics, generative grammar is grammar (the set of language rules) that indicates the structure and interpretation of sentences that native speakers of a language accept as belonging to their language. Adopting the term generative from mathematics, linguist Noam Chomsky introduced the concept of generative grammar in the 1950s.

Definition and Examples of Generative Grammar

In this perspective, the object of linguistic research is "knowledge of English", whereas the aim of the generative linguist consists in the description of "the internal cognitive system which is the basis of the human language capacity in general, and of a specific speaker's linguistic knowledge in particular".

Generative grammar is a linguistic theory that regards linguistics as the study of a hypothesised innate grammatical structure. A sociobiological modification of structuralist theories, especially glossematics, generative grammar considers grammar as a system of rules that generates exactly those combinations of words that form grammatical sentences in a given language.
