Asylum in International Law - Indian Legal Solution

L. 104-132, § 421(a), inserted at end
“The Attorney General may not grant an alien asylum if the Attorney General determines that the alien is excludable under subclause (I), (II), or (III) of section 1182(a)(3)(B)(i) of this title or deportable under section 1251(a)(4)(B) of this title, unless the Attorney General determines, in the discretion of the Attorney General, that there are not reasonable grounds for regarding the alien as a danger to the security of the United States.

Asylum is when a person, who is afraid of being prosecuted in his home state, runs away to another state for protection. In the case of Colombia vs Peru (1950), it was held by the court
