Write the objective for the lesson. Outline the main topics or ideas you wish to cover during the lesson. The overview will function as the foundation upon which the lesson will be built.

Indent the first word in a paragraph (start the first word of the paragraph a little to the right of the left-hand margin. Start a paragraph with a topic sentence, which states the main idea of that paragraph. Any time you begin writing about a new idea, begin a new paragraph. Paragraphs answer questions about a certain topic.

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
