Single lung transplantation requires posterolateral thoracotomy. The native lung is removed, and the bronchus, pulmonary artery, and pulmonary veins of the donor lung are anastomosed to their respective cuffs. The bronchial anastomosis requires intussusception or wrapping with omentum or pericardium to facilitate adequate healing.

The International Society for Heart and Lung Transplantation (2014) updated its consensus-based guidelines on the selection of lung transplant recipients.²² These guidelines made the following statements about lung transplantation: "Lung transplantation should be considered for adults with chronic, end-stage lung disease who meet all the following general criteria: High (>50%) risk of death from lung disease within 2 years if lung transplantation is not performed.

People with serious lung diseases who meet certain criteria of lung function are most appropriately treated with a lung transplant. The traditional age limit for lung transplantation is 65 years. At Mayo Clinic, however, we will evaluate individuals older than 65 who do not have significant disease processes besides their lung diseases.

Lung transplant surgery is often done with the use of a heart-lung machine. This device does the work of your heart and lungs while your heart and lungs are stopped for the surgery. For single lung transplants, the cut is made on the side of your chest where the lung will be transplanted. The operation takes 4 to 8 hours.

People who are candidates for lung transplant are those likely to die from lung disease within two years. Idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis is the most common condition treated with lung transplant. The cause is unknown (idiopathic), and there is no cure for this thickening and scarring of the lung tissue.
