Music of the Ottoman Court and Mevlevî Order Music played an important role at the Ottoman court in Istanbul and at the Anatolian princely courts, where the Ottoman sultans and princes initially modeled their courts on those of the Tîmûrids, a Turko-Mongol empire (ca. 1370-1507), and the Safavids, a Persian dynasty (1501-1722).
