The new question is whether this means that all congenital conditions no longer need code 779.89 even if they don't have their own specific neonatal or congenital code. It is doubtful that an official clarification will be forthcoming before Coding Clinic for ICD-9 is stopped in favor of the ICD-10 version. However, with the caveat that an unofficial opinion does not constitute official coding instruction, it seems that the answer to the question would be no.

The confusion about whether there is a weight restriction comes from the introduction of 99298, which is a new code for the recovering very low birth weight infant. These newborns weigh less than 1500 grams at birth.
