Background: The research reported in this article was commissioned by a consortium of inner-city schools located in central England. It was commissioned in response to the consortium's concerns regarding increasing referrals of negative pupil behaviour amongst its secondary school pupils in Key Stage 3 (ages 11-14), resulting in temporary and permanent exclusions.

### Understanding Problematic Pupil Behaviour: Perceptions of ...

The behaviour issue was most apparent in pupil-referral units - 89 per cent of teachers in PRUs said behaviour had got worse. In special education needs schools, 63 per cent of teachers said behaviour had declined; in local authority maintained schools the proportion was 62 per cent; in free schools it was 60 per cent; and in academies it was 56 per cent.
