The Nature of Managerial Work. Managers are responsible for the processes of getting activities completed efficiently with and through other people and setting and achieving the firm’s goals through the execution of four basic management functions: planning, organizing, leading, and controlling.

1.3 Who Are Managers? – Principles of Management

Henry Mintzberg identified 10 roles (read functions) which managers play in organizations. A typical manager, according to Mintzberg, acts as a monitor, disseminator, spokesperson, figure-head, leader, liaison, entrepreneur, disturbance handler, resource allocator and negotiator.
